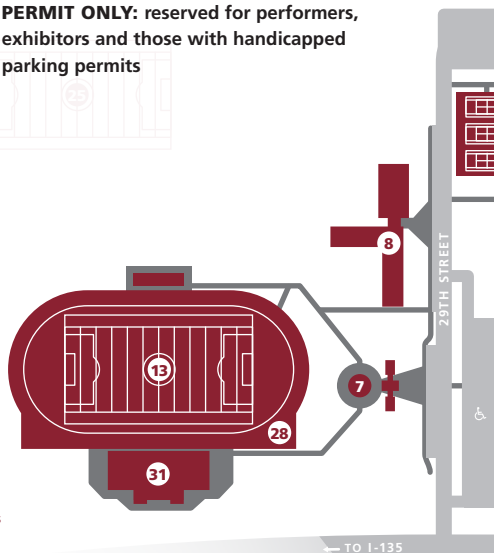
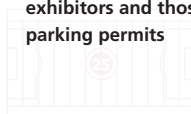

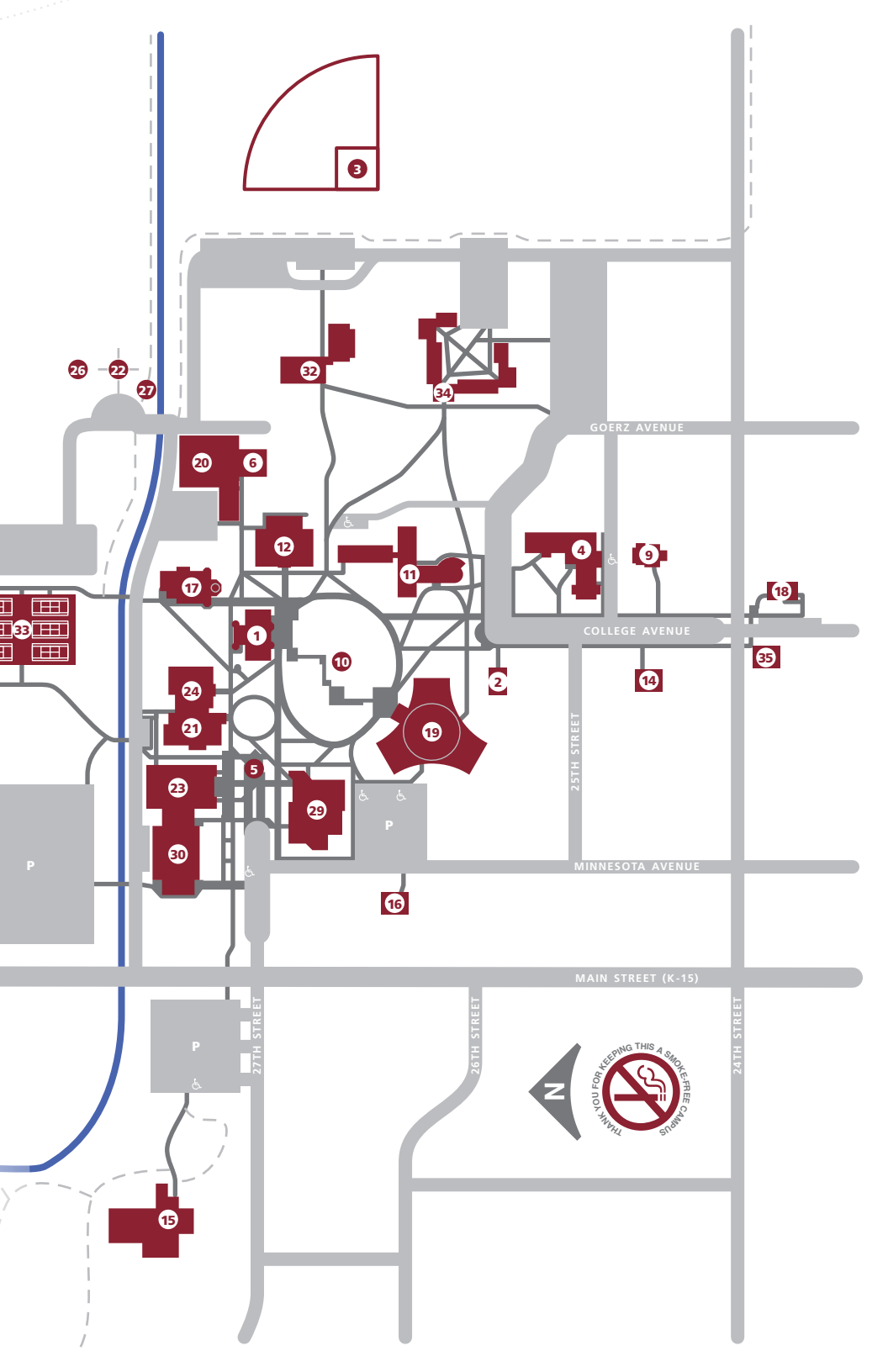

Godspell by Stephen Schwartz and John-Michael Tebelak**

*Godspell* was the first major musical theater work of three-time Grammy® and Academy Award® winner Stephen Schwartz (*Wicked*, *Pippin*, *Children of Eden*). It opened off-Broadway in 1971 and took the world by storm with a parade of well-loved songs, including “Day by Day,” “Prepare Ye the Way of the Lord,” “Turn Back, O Man,” and “All Good Gifts.” Based mostly on the parables in the book of Matthew, the musical features a small company of performers, who help Jesus convey his message using a wide variety of games, storytelling techniques and a hefty dose of comic timing. With its eclectic blend of musical styles, ranging from pop to vaudeville, *Godspell* invigorates the central themes of Matthew’s Gospel – kindness, tolerance and love.
