ADMISSION

Students wishing to register for Summer 2018 courses must be admitted to Bethel College as special students or as regular degree seeking students. Students who were not enrolled during the Fall 2017, Interterm 2018 or Spring 2018 terms should check with the Admissions Office (316-283-2500) to see what is required for admission to Bethel.

REGISTRATION

Currently enrolled students should enroll for Summer 2018 courses through April 30. The college reserves the right to withdraw from its offerings low enrollment courses. Students wishing to take a course should register within these dates to ensure that courses will have sufficient enrollments. The final day to register for any Summer 2018 course is on the second class day of the course.

SUMMER SESSION

There is no single summer session at Bethel College. Courses can begin the Monday following commencement and must end by July 31, 2018. Classes will meet on the days and at the times specified in the attached schedule.

GRADUATION DATES

Two dates have been set for conferring degrees (graduation) during the summer. The first date is mid-summer, July 2, 2018, and the second date is August 1, 2018. Contact the Registrar's Office for details.

FEE SCHEDULES

Tuition for Summer 2018 courses is \$515.00 per credit hour; \$375.00 per credit hour for internships. There are no discounts or audit rates applied to tuition during the summer term. Directed studies will be assessed an additional **NON-REFUNDABLE** \$275.00 Directed Study fee. All registration changes after the second day of class will be subject to a \$15 fee, with the exception of requesting CR/NC grading.

FINANCIAL REGISTRATION — PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES

Financial Registration is the final step in completing the enrollment process. To be financially cleared, students must pay full tuition to the Business Office no later than 4:00 pm on the second day that the summer semester begins. Students who do not meet this deadline will be dropped from classes.

DIRECTED STUDIES

Students wishing to take Directed Studies must complete a Summer Directed Study Application (available from the Registrar's Office), approved by the Registrar. Summer 2018 Directed Studies must be completed by July 31. Directed Studies are subject to regular Summer tuition rates plus a **NON-REFUNDABLE** \$275 Directed Study fee. **SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS AND REGULATIONS APPLY TO SUMMER DIRECTED STUDIES. SEE REGISTRAR FOR DETAILS.**

GRADING

Courses dropped during the first two days of class are not recorded on the student's permanent record. A grade of "WP" (Withdraw Passing) or "WF" (Withdraw Failing) will be assigned when students drop a course after the second day of class. The final day to withdraw or request CR/NC grading in a course is the first day after 60% of the course is complete.

ADDITIONAL ONLINE OFFERINGS

Have you considered taking a course or even two this summer? Wondering how you can do it with a job? Bethel College is now part of OCICU (Online Consortium of Independent Colleges and Universities) where all courses are online. These courses appear on your transcript as Bethel College courses. You won't have to send an official transcript from summer work!

Some students cannot always get required classes into their schedule in the fall or spring terms. Examples of classes that students often transfer in from the summer are General Psychology, Sociology, Intermediate or College Algebra, Statistics, etc. OCICU has such courses available to you.

This online option is available to students that have to take a summer course to make up for a class they missed or can't take because they are out of sequence. Other students may need to earn more hours to meet the 24 hrs. needed for NAIA eligibility. You do have to be a self-motivated, organized, committed degree-seeking student that has above a 2.000 CUM GPA.
