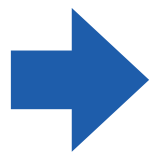


WE ARE THRESHERS PROTECTING OUR COMMUNITY SAFETY PLAN

GREEN (LOW RISK)



- **Green level indicates only minor changes.**
- Masks are required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person are exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the aforementioned space.)
- Practice 6' physical distancing
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks are required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or the Human Resource office immediately.
- 6' physical distancing in the classroom (maximize classroom use)
- 6' physical distancing in the Caf
- Adhere to CDC recommended best practices for meetings.
- Students are free to leave for, and return after, breaks.
- Travel to a recognized Kansas Department of Health & Environment (KDHE) hot-spot zone or internationally must result in a mandatory two-week self-quarantine for students and personnel upon return, or before returning, to campus.

BLUE

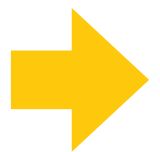
(LOW RISK, BUT HIGHER ALERT)



- **Move to level Blue when the Harvey County Health Department has indicated increased level of exposures in the county, and/or one or more cases of COVID-19 is identified on campus.**
- Masks are required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person are exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the aforementioned space.)
- Practice 6' physical distancing
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks are required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- 6' physical distancing in the classroom (maximize classroom use)
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or the Human Resource office immediately.
- 6' physical distancing in the Caf
- Adhere to CDC recommended best practices for meetings.
- If travel to a recognized KDHE hot-spot zone or internationally is necessary, a two-week self-quarantine is required for students and personnel upon return, or before returning, to campus.
- **Students are urged to use caution when leaving for, and returning after, breaks.**
- **No nonessential work travel to a recognized KDHE hot-spot zone or internationally. Consult with Student Life or a supervisor to define "nonessential" and "necessary" work travel.**

SAFETY PLAN

YELLOW (MODERATE RISK)



- **Move to level Yellow when a cluster is identified. A disease cluster is the occurrence of a greater than expected number of cases of a particular disease within a group of people in a geographic area over a defined period of time.**
- Masks are required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person are exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the aforementioned space.)
- Practice 6' physical distancing
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks are required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- 6' physical distancing in the classroom (maximize classroom use).
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or the Human Resource office immediately.
- 6' physical distancing in the Caf
- If travel to a recognized KDHE hot-spot zone or internationally is necessary, a two-week self-quarantine is required for students and personnel upon return, or before returning, to campus.
- No nonessential work travel to a recognized KDHE hot-spot zone or internationally. Consult with Student Life or a supervisor to define "nonessential" and "necessary" work travel.
- **Replace in-person meetings with video-or tele-conference calls whenever possible.**
- **Students are encouraged to minimize off-campus travel.**
- **Additional physical distancing measures may be put into place, increasing sections of classes. Clusters can be contained with quarantine and isolation.**
- **Students will not return after Thanksgiving break—finals will be online.**

ORANGE (HIGH RISK)



- **Move to level Orange when a community spread is identified. A community spread is the circulation of a disease among people in a certain area with no clear explanation of how they were infected.**
- Masks are required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person are exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the aforementioned space.)
- Practice 6' physical distancing
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks are required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or the Human Resource office immediately.
- No nonessential work travel to a recognized KDHE hot-spot zone or internationally. Consult with Student Life or a supervisor to define "nonessential" and "necessary" work travel.
- If travel to a recognized KDHE hot-spot zone or internationally is necessary, a two-week self-quarantine is required for students and personnel upon return, or before returning, to campus.
- Students will not return after Thanksgiving break—finals will be online.
- **Breaks may be eliminated.**
- **Students will be asked to stay on campus except for essential worker and accreditation programs (Nursing, Social Work, Teacher Education) functions.**
- **Local students may be asked to return to off-campus permanent residences to reduce density in residence halls until the situation is resolved.**
- **Instruction moves to a hybrid model with limited use of the classroom.**
- **The Caf will offer pick-up service only.**
- **Outside guests are not allowed in campus buildings at this time. Guests are defined as visitors not essential to campus operations.**
- **Telework, when possible, will begin to increase physical distancing. A rotating staff schedule will be implemented. Replace all in-person meetings with video-or tele-conference calls.**

RED

(SEVERE RISK)



- **Move to level Red when the number of positive cases on campus is greater than Bethel's ability to quarantine and isolate effectively.**
- Masks are required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person are exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the aforementioned space.)
- Practice 6' physical distancing
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks are required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or the Human Resource office immediately.
- Outside guests are not allowed on campus at this time. Guests are defined as visitors not essential to campus operations.
- **All classes are moved to distance learning, except accreditation programs.**
- **Begin to minimize the number of students on campus. Students may stay on campus if: their second residence is in a hot-spot zone; they are an essential worker; they are a part of an accreditation program; they would be placed in a compromised living situation off-campus; they test positive for COVID-19.**
- **The Caf will offer pick-up service only.**
- **Telework is mandatory for campus operations; only essential personnel is on campus. All meetings will be held with video-or tele-conference calls.**

GRAY

(SHUTDOWN OF CAMPUS)



- The Harvey County Health Department and/or KDHE recommends all Bethel personnel and students vacate the physical plant.
- Distance learning for all programs begins.
- All meetings, events and gatherings will be held with video-or tele-conference calls.
- Students who must stay on campus are allowed to remain if: their second residence is in a hot-spot zone; they are a part of an accreditation program; they would be placed in a compromised living situation off-campus; they test positive for COVID-19.
