## INFECTIOUS DISEASE COLOR STATUS

### BLUE

(LOW RISK, HIGH ALERT)



**0-1.5% campus population positive with unrelated cases;  
Harvey County positivity rate <10%.**

- Masks required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the space.)
- In-person instruction for all courses with 100% of class sessions per week in-person.
- Allow remote learning for students in isolation/quarantine only for classes when faculty are required to isolate/quarantine.
- All employees working in person.
- Mandate 6' physical distancing.
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or Human Resources immediately.
- 6' physical distancing in the Caf.
- Take-away food available.
- Adhere to CDC-recommended best practices for meetings.
- Students urged to use caution when leaving for, and returning after, breaks.
- No travel work restrictions. Refer to Kansas Department of Health & Environment, CDC or U.S. State Department for any directions on isolation/quarantine measures related to travel restrictions. (Consult the operational coordinator of the Infectious Disease Management Team if necessary.)
- Restricted access to residence halls by non-residents including outside guests, non-resident staff and others.
- Athletics will follow NAIA and KCAC athletic policies.

## INFECTIOUS DISEASE COLOR STATUS

**YELLOW**  
(MODERATE RISK)



**Two or more unrelated “clusters” or 1.5-2% campus population positive; Harvey County positivity rate 10-15%.**

- Masks required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the space.)
- In-person instruction for all courses with a maximum of 25% of all class sessions per week remote/hybrid.
- Direct supervisors, in consultation with administrative cabinet members and Human Resources, will evaluate offices that share a direct working environment where employees cannot physically distance for staggered, decreased staffing or potential remote work.
- Mandate 6’ physical distancing.
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or Human Resources immediately.
- 6’ physical distancing in the Caf.
- Take-away food available.
- Adhere to CDC-recommended best practices for meetings.
- Students urged to use caution when leaving for, and returning after, breaks.
- Work travel may be restricted. If work travel is required, communicate with direct supervisor and refer to Kansas Department of Health & Environment, CDC or U.S. State Department for any directions on isolation/quarantine measures related to travel restrictions. (Consult the operational coordinator of the Infectious Disease Management Team if necessary.)
- Restricted access to residence halls by non-residents including outside guests, non-resident staff and others.
- Athletics will follow NAIA and KCAC athletic policies.

## INFECTIOUS DISEASE COLOR STATUS

**ORANGE**  
(HIGH RISK)



**Community spread on campus determined by HCHD; isolation and quarantine spaces at 75% capacity; Campus Clear app shows 25-30% campus population indicating symptoms; Harvey County positivity rate 15-20%.**

- Masks required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the space.)
- In-person instruction for all courses, with a maximum of 50% of all class sessions per week being remote/hybrid. Exceptions for accredited programs – Nursing, Social Work, Education.
- Lateral movement between phases of plan (classes may need to start and stop based upon health status of the community).
- Direct supervisors, in consultation with administrative cabinet members and Human Resources, will evaluate offices that share a direct working environment where employees cannot physically distance for staggered, decreased staffing or potential remote work.
- Mandate 6' physical distancing.
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.
- Students and personnel exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 must tell Student Life or Human Resources immediately.
- All dining service will be pick-up only.
- Adhere to CDC-recommended best practices for meetings.
- Students urged to use caution when leaving for, and returning after, breaks.
- Restricted travel. No nonessential work travel permitted. Direct supervisor to define "nonessential" and "necessary" work travel. Refer to Kansas Department of Health & Environment, CDC or U.S. State Department for directions on isolation/quarantine measures related to travel restrictions. (Consult the operational coordinator of the Infectious Disease Management Team if necessary.)
- Restricted access to residence halls by non-residents including outside guests, non-resident staff and others.
- Athletics will follow NAIA and KCAC athletic policies.

## INFECTIOUS DISEASE COLOR STATUS

**RED**  
(SEVERE RISK)



**Isolation and quarantine spaces at 90% capacity; near-critical supply levels; Campus Clear app shows >35% campus population indicating symptoms; Harvey County positivity rate 20%+.**

- Masks required in all indoor and outdoor spaces. (Offices occupied by one person exempt from mask requirements until another individual enters the space.)
- In-person instruction for all courses, with a maximum of 75% of all class sessions per week being remote/hybrid. Exceptions for accredited programs – Nursing, Social Work, Education.
- Lateral movement between phases of plan (classes may need to start and stop based upon health status of the community).
- Direct supervisors, in consultation with administrative cabinet members and Human Resources, will evaluate offices that share a direct working environment where employees cannot physically distance for staggered, decreased staffing or potential remote work.
- Mandate 6' physical distancing.
- Sanitation stations must be used in and out of buildings.
- Personal daily temperature checks required, with results posted in the symptom data tracker app #CampusClear.

**GRAY**  
(SHUTDOWN)



**Infections greater than Bethel's ability to isolate and quarantine effectively; critical supplies depleted, or inability to maintain critical supply chain; overwhelmed local health-care capacity.**

- Residence halls closed.
- Remote learning for all programs (HLC approval required).
- Students meeting pre-established COVID-related criteria may request to remain on campus.
- No visitors in residence halls.
- No dining services.
- No athletics activities.
- No access to campus.
- Remote work required for all campus operations.
