Note 1: All data are based on Fall IPEDS reports.

Note 2: This table summarizes the graduation rate for athletes by sport and by gender and the cohort class by gender. The cohort class (the baseline group) is defined as first-time freshmen who enter fall semester as full-time, degree-seeking students. From this cohort class, those students who receive financial aid for participation in athletics are partitioned into subgroups classified by sport, by gender, and by race. All groups are tracked for six years as required by the Student Right to Know Act. Graduation rates are expressed as percentages. No percentages are reported by race because the "cell" size for these groups are small enough to permit students to be personally identified--which is a violation of their right to privacy under FERPA.

Note 3: The category "Other Sports" includes cross-country, golf, volleyball, soccer, softball, and tennis.
